MRH&C Announces New Construction, Renovation Project to Meet the Needs and Growth of the Community

Mobridge Regional Hospital & Clinics is pleased to announce a new on-campus building and renovation project.

Over the last 61 years, MRH&C has built a legacy of offering and delivering high-quality health care to its community. As the community grows, the hospital and its clinics must adapt to meet the needs of patients. While health care providers and services have evolved with the times, MRH&C facilities have remained largely the same.

"We see a lot of patients for a 25-bed critical access hospital in a town of less than 4,000 people," said John J. Ayoub, Chief Executive Officer of MRH&C. "Rather than continuing to fix issues as they arise, we believe a new building construction and renovation will allow us to take a holistic approach that keeps patients here at home for their care."

Planned Enhancements of the Project

The new construction project will consist of four phases, beginning in Spring 2021 and continuing for about 36 months. There will be more than 29,000 square feet of new construction and over 26,000 square feet of renovation, leaving nearly 39,000 square feet to remain as it is currently.

Todd's personal philosophy: "Work hard always, help others always, and life will be fulfilling."



The total cost of the project will be around \$43 million. It will be funded by:

- United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) direct loans (~\$30 million contribution)
- USDA guaranteed loans (~\$7.5 million contribution)
- Equity contribution from the hospital (\$5 million)

The new building will include a patient wing that allows for advanced med/surg, obstetrics, pharmacy, and infusion therapy services. The hospital's surgery and imaging departments will undergo renovations, along with the



Impact on the Community

By investing in the new building and renovations over the next three years, there are many benefits to both MRH&C staff and the community. The renovated layout will allow for enhanced departmental adjacencies, ultimately improving staff efficiency and overall workflow. This will help MRH&C better recruit and retain staff, including visiting specialists, due to increased safety, efficiencies, pride, and confidence of the hospital.

emergency room, which will include an ambulance bay and helipad. Expansion of the clinic and specialty clinic will round out the project.

"I've been in medicine for 40 years, and this is one of the best laid-out remodels in construction due to the improvements in workflow, traffic, and security for patients and staff," said Mark Vandersnick, RN, Chief Nursing Officer at MRH&C.

Ayoub said the cost of care at MRH&C will not increase because of the project, as funding for the building is not directly tied to the cost of patient services. Health care services will continue as normal without interruption.

The Decision to Build

Planning for the project began in 2017. MRH&C believed the facility could be updated and structured in a way to improve efficiency and care.

"We're providing 21st century care in a 20th century building," Ayoub said. "We wanted to be very comprehensive with this project, with the goal of doing it once and getting it done right the first time. Our goal is for it to create a welcoming and healing environment for patients, visitors, and staff."

MRH&C initially opened its doors in July 1959, with additions and renovations made in 1976, 1977, 1991, 1998 and 2014. Much of the current facility's main infrastructure is more than 62 years old.

"We want to keep what is good and working while updating and renewing the infrastructure to allow us to provide excellent care for the next 40 years," Ayoub said. The new construction also supports current and future volume expansion as well as any future services the community may grow to need.

"MRH&C continues to add providers, in both our clinics and specialty clinics," Ayoub said. "We have seen, and expect to continue to see, increases in our volumes, services, and offerings. This project will allow us to invest in our next generation of competent and compassionate caregivers."

Ayoub noted the economic development benefits of the project as well. Short-term, the project will bring workers to town who will dine, shop, and stay at our local businesses. Longterm, as MRH&C continues to grow and expand services, more people will flock to town to seek care they need.

"It's good for our community, good for our employees, and good for surrounding communities to show that we're growing and want to continue to grow to satisfy patient needs now and into the future," Vandersnick said.
