



For the second year in a row, during a pandemic, Mobridge Regional Hospital has been named by the Chartis Center for Rural Health as a Top 100 Critical Access Hospital. This means that MRH&C is a part of the top 7% of Critical Access Hospitals across the United States. Receiving such a huge honor would not be possible without our team of dedicated professionals.

"I appreciate all of our staff's excellent work to provide the highest quality care and patient service experience – living our mission by truly providing 'high-quality healthcare services in a compassionate and professional manner for people throughout the

region," said John J. Ayoub, CEO. "It is exciting and heartening to know that we have earned this honor in four of the past six years. I consider this a testament to our staff's dedication that we've been recognized for two years in a row during a global pandemic. We truly are professional people, with a personal touch."

The Critical Access Hospital designation is given to eligible rural hospitals by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services. Every hospital given this designation provides vital healthcare services to rural communities. Being named in the Top 100 for four out of the last six years means that MRH&C has been continually recognized, on a national level, for the high-quality healthcare we provide to the areas we serve.

MRH&C sends a huge thank you to our staff for their integrity, compassion, collaboration, and excellence in work that makes vital healthcare access available to the communities we serve.

At MRH&C, we have a Certified Nurse-Midwife/Certified Nurse Practitioner, three Family Practice Physicians who offer OB services, and a visiting OB/GYN doctor. Dr. Emily Boden is one of our Family Medicine and OB providers at MRH&C. She has practiced in Mobridge for the last several years and is originally from Timber Lake. After growing up in the area and now working in our community, she said it is vital that OB services are offered

"Babies don't care about your timing or planning," she said. "At MRH&C, we cover a large area. We are a Critical Access Hospital. Without us, a lot of moms in this area might not even be able to make it to the care they need."

Dr. Boden said she loves practicing both in Family Medicine and OB because she gets to deliver babies then care for them as they grow up. She loves that she gets to see the whole life cycle.

"I've helped one mom deliver two of her babies. Now, I get to take care of them as they grow up. It is so rewarding," she said. "I am part of an amazing team that makes one-on-one care possible for moms in this area. We make it possible for them to get this vital care closer to home."

In addition to Family Medicine and OB service lines, we also have four Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists (CRNAs). They can provide epidurals and help during labor and delivery as well as provide anesthesia and more in surgical settings. Preston Huber is a CRNA at MRH&C and head of the anesthesia department. He said that there is an opportunity for job shadowing at the hospital and encourages young people in the area to consider a healthcare profession at MRH&C.

"The role of a CRNA is vital for any patient needing surgical intervention especially in the rural setting," Huber said. "We administer anesthesia to keep the patient comfortable during surgery, provide pain relief for OB patients and can help stabilize patients in the Emergency Department and Intensive Care Unit settings."

Brooke Sherbeck, MSN, CRNA, is the latest addition to that team. She said she loves visiting with expecting mothers and their babies as well as helping ancillary departments and colleagues. She is looking forward to working with the MRH&C team to help the community.

"There is nothing better than seeing fear, anxiety, or pain being replaced with a smile," Sherbeck said. "Healthcare is oftentimes intimidating to patients because they don't understand. I want my patients to understand the 'why.' Effective communication is important."

At MRH&C, our goal is always to provide our patients with wellrounded service. We are able to care for you individually and as a family unit. No matter what your healthcare needs are, we are here for you from before birth and throughout your life.

"We are a smaller hospital, but that just means that we can provide more care and attention," Dr. Boden said. "People would be surprised at how much we can do."
